Boys & Girls Clubs of the Virginia Peninsula Announces Sponsorship of the At-Risk Afterschool Meals Program – Eat SMART

(Newport News, VA) October 16, 2018 – Boys & Girls Clubs of the Virginia Peninsula announces the sponsorship of the At-Risk Afterschool Meals Program, also known as Eat SMART. The Eat SMART program ensures that every child gets a nutritionally balanced meal every day. Healthy diets are essential to the overall growth and development of children, and these meals give them the alertness they need to excel in school. These meals will be available at no separate charge to all participants at each site.

In accordance with Federal civil rights law and U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) civil rights regulations and policies, the USDA, its Agencies, offices, and employees, and institutions participating in or administering USDA programs are prohibited from discriminating based on race, color, national origin, sex, disability, age, or reprisal or retaliation for prior civil rights activity in any program or activity conducted or funded by USDA.
